Medical Services

Should you require medical attention while on board, the infirmary staff is available to assist you 24 hours a day. Our shipboard infirmaries meet or exceed the Medical Facilities Guidelines established by the International Council of Cruise Lines and the American College of Emergency Physicians. The medical staff is from the fields of Emergency Medicine and/or Family Practice and is certified in Advanced Cardiac Life Support.

Our physicians are independent contractors and, as such, are entitled to render services at a customary charge. The charge for their services and any other medical expenses will be applied to your Sail & Sign account. Should you require hospitalization, surgery or treatment for a serious condition, we will make arrangements to transfer you to a medical facility ashore. The ability to transfer you to a shore-side facility may be limited or delayed by weather or logistical considerations. If you are referred to a shore-side facility, Carnival will not be responsible for the cost of the treatment. Your health insurance coverage may not be accepted at the shore-side facilities and ports of call; however, you may be able to seek reimbursement from your insurance carrier after you return home. Refer to your individual health insurance policy for details.

If you are currently suffering from a serious medical condition, please consult with your personal physician prior to sailing. If you are taking medication or want the medical staff to be aware of special needs, please contact our infirmary. This will ensure they will be prepared if you need assistance.

If you come down with a contagious disease, or even suspect a contagious disease, you are required to report to the ship's infirmary for the safety of everyone on board.

If you require intramuscular or subcutaneous injections to treat a medical condition, please avoid injury to our crew members and other guests by using a Sharps container to dispose of needles. If you need an additional Sharps container while on board, please advise your Stateroom Steward or the Information Desk.

Medications

Hand-carry required medication in your pocket or purse so that it will be available when needed. Checked luggage may not be accessible at all times.

If you are taking prescription drugs, vitamins or other medication on a regular basis, bring an adequate supply with you since these may not be readily available on board ship or in ports of call. Commonly used medications may be purchased at the office of the shipboard doctor. Please note that the Camp Carnival staff does not administer medications to children.

Will I Get Seasick?

Seasickness is rare on ships as large as ours. All our ships are equipped with stabilizers that are designed to keep them smooth and steady in the water. If you should feel queasy, medicine is available from your Stateroom Steward, the Information Desk or the ship's infirmary.

Are there Babysitters?

Baby-sitting for children 11 years old and under is available from 22:00 to 03:00 every evening in the Children's Playroom and is supervised by our specially trained Camp Carnival Youth Counselors.

Baby-sitting is offered in the form of a Pajama Party; pillows, blankets, and cribs are provided. The cost is \$6 per hour for the first child in the family and \$4 per hour for each additional sibling. In addition to our evening baby-sitting services, we also offer morning care for children under the age of 2 on port days, from port arrival time until noon, for the same charge.
